	Part 1/Part 2	
Habitat	5 / 6	The place where a plant or animal normally lives which has what is necessary to survive.
Native Plant	5/2	A plant that has been in a particular place for a very long time—for tens of thousands of years or even, in some cases, millions of years
Perennial	2/1	Plants that bears leaves and often flowers every year. They usually die in the winter and reemerge again in the spring or summer.
Ecosystem	3/8	An ecosystem is a group of living things that interact with each other in a specific environment
Pollinator	1/3	Insects that help carry pollen from the male part of the flower to the female part of the flower.
Germinate	1/0	A plant developing from a seed or spore after a period of dormancy
Millstone	4 / 0	Each of 2 circular stones used for grinding grain

	Part 1/Part 2	
Carnivorous Plants	0 / 4	Plants that get some of their nutrients by trapping insects or other small animals and consuming them.
Endangered	0/3	A plant or animal at serious risk of extinction.
Photosynthesis	0/2	Process by which green plants use sunlight to make carbon dioxide and water releasing oxygen as a byproduct.
Deciduous	0/2	A tree or shrub that sheds its leaves every year.
Evergreen	0/1	A plant that keeps its green leaves all year.
Indigenous People	0/2	Native to a particular place who live or lived in an interconnected relationship with the environment: Native Americans
Latitude	0/1	The distance north or south of the equator measured in degrees.
