<p style="text-align: center;">NATIVE PLANT</p> <p>A native plant is a plant that has been in a particular place for a very, very long time</p>	
<p style="text-align: center;">PERENNIAL</p> <p>Perennials are plants that keep growing year after year, though their leaves may turn brown & die in fall & winter.</p>

<p style="text-align: center;">CARNIVOROUS PLANTS</p> <p>Both of these are types of carnivorous plants—plants that eat meat!</p>	
<p style="text-align: center;">ENDANGERED</p> <p>The endangered plants garden is a home for plants that are rare & might easily become extinct without protection.</p>	
<p style="text-align: center;">PHOTOSYNTHESIS</p> <p>Plants use photosynthesis to make food from the sun's energy.</p>
